Lot 37 19th century Maps of Ireland and the Environs of Dublin; and city plans of Dublin Cork and Belfast, 1851. Estimate should read €250-€300.

Lot 47 Standard of the Kingdom of Ireland. The date of this lot should be 19th century. Our thanks to Dr. John Gilmartin for his assistance in cataloguing this flag.

Lot 55 The Costello Volunteers were raised in 1779 and were also known as MacCostelloe's Regiment. They were commanded by Colonel Charles Costello.

Lot 91 Great Exhibition Medal, estimate should read €100-€150.

Lot 99 Estimate should read €200-€250.

Lot 216 Additional information: The Irish Times, Saturday, January 4, 1941 reports that Mr Edward Plant, whose house at Rathdown Park, Terenure was demolished on Thursday [January 2] formerly lived at 93 Donore Terrace, South Circular Road, one of the two houses demolished in Friday's [January 3] bombing. There was no loss of life in the bombings but the Irish Times records that a dead parrot was found in one house.

Lot 238 The maker of these pistols is Wilson of Dublin, they may have been retailed by Kavanagh.

Lot 389 1960s Athletics Autographs of Olympic Champions. Estimate should read €200-€400.

Lot 455. The 1917 has mintmark S for Sydney, Australia.

Lot 457. Should read: George V gold half sovereigns 1912, 1913, 1914 and 1915

Lot 470 Description should read 1966 Rising Anniversary silver ten shillings mint, 4 rolls of 20. Two rolls opened, two unopened, with original brown paper wrappers (80 coins), uncirculated to briliant uncirculated. Estimate €900-€1,100.
